Some drugs can actually help our health and wellbeing.</p>	<p>In an emergency, you would need to get specialist help. How can I predict, assess and manage risks, hazard and danger?		<p>An emergency situation often involves a casualty (an injured or ill person).</p>		
How can I react to being under pressure?		<p>The definition of a drug is 'a substance that causes a physiological change on the body when it enters the body'.</p>		
How do I stay safe when I am out and about?		<p>Remember - always try to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • keep yourself and the casualty safe; • stop anyone from getting any further injuries; • treat injuries quickly and safely; • seek help from the emergency services if needed. 	<p>Risk: a situation involving exposure to danger.</p> 	
What are dangerous substances?			<p>Hazard: a potential source of danger.</p> 	
What is first aid?			<p>Danger: the possibility of suffering harm or injury.</p> 	
<p>Some emergency situations involve injuries or illnesses that cannot be dealt with safely without the help of the emergency services.</p>		<p>All drugs can be dangerous if they are taken incorrectly.</p>		
<p>Some responsibilities might seem challenging at first but with experience and maturity, we get more confident and can look after ourselves and others.</p>		<p>People must never have someone else's medication if a doctor hasn't prescribed it for them.</p>
